DAYTON, Ohio, May 12.—The wedding of Miss Dorothy Forster Patterson, daughter of John Henry Patterson, President of the National Cash Register Company, and Noble Brandon Judah, Jr., of Chicago, was celebrated this afternoon at Far Hills, the Patterson home.

The wedding had been hastened by the war, as the bridegroom is the commanding officer of the First Field Artillery, Chicago, and may be called to the colors within a week. He has been in New York for a few weeks, since returning from the Mexican border, where he saw service last Summer.

Only the immediate family and a few friends were present at the ceremony, which was performed by Bishop Boyd Vincent of Christ Episcopal Church, Cincinnati, and the Rev. Dr. Dimpel of Christ Church, Dayton. During the services the stringed instruments and harp, part of the Cincinnati Symphony Orchestra, were played, and later the orchestra music was played for the dancers.

The bride wore a gown of white satin with a Court train, and carried white orchids. Her only attendant was her cousin, Mrs. Turner Donaldson Moorehead of Pittsburgh.
